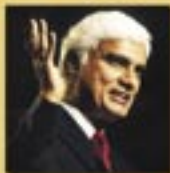

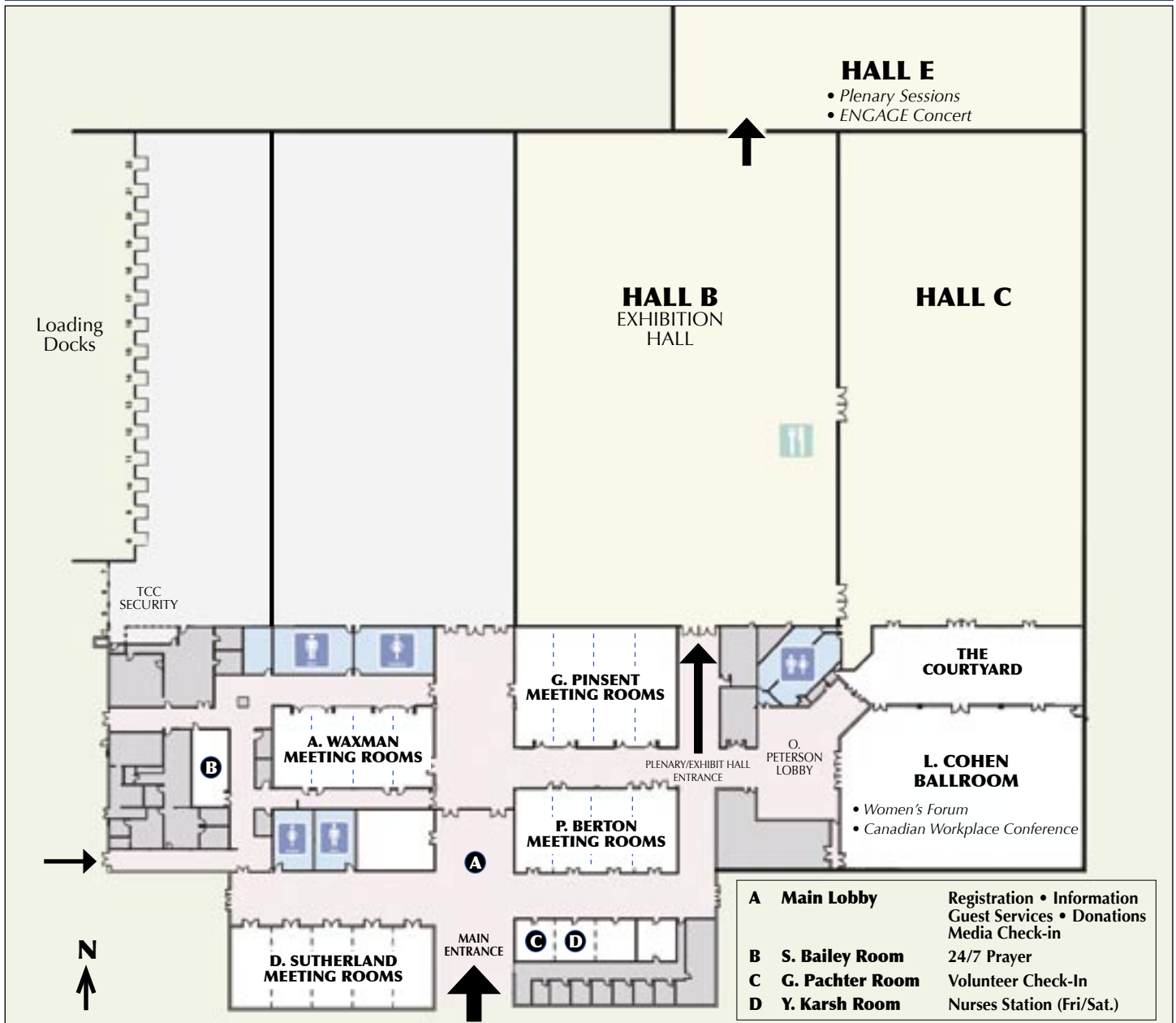

Directions to the Toronto Congress Centre

The Toronto Congress Centre, located near Pearson airport, is spacious and centrally located. Parking at the TCC is free of charge.

By car (via highways)

- West on 401, exit Dixon Road W, turn right into Toronto Congress Centre.
- East on 401, exit Dixon Road W (left), turn right into Toronto Congress Centre.
- North on 427, exit Dixon Road E (right), turn left into Toronto Congress Centre.
- North on 427, follow 27 N to Dixon Road E, turn left into Toronto Congress Centre.
- South on 427, exit 409 E to Martin Grove Road, travel south on Martin Grove Road, turn right on Dixon Road, turn right into Toronto Congress Centre.
- West on 407, exit 27 S, follow 27 S to Dixon

Road E, turn left into Toronto Congress Centre.
• East on 407, exit 27 S, follow 27 S to Dixon Road E, turn left into Toronto Congress Centre.

By car (via downtown)

- From the Harbourfront area of downtown Toronto, take the Gardiner Expressway W to Hwy 427 N, follow Hwy 27 to Dixon Road E exit, turn left into Toronto Congress Centre.
- From the East areas of Greater Toronto, travel the Don Valley Parkway N to Hwy 401 W, follow Hwy 401 W to Dixon Road W exit, turn right into Toronto Congress Centre.

By public transportation

- Travel to the Lawrence West Subway station then transfer to the Malton #58 bus which will take you directly in front of the Toronto Congress Centre.

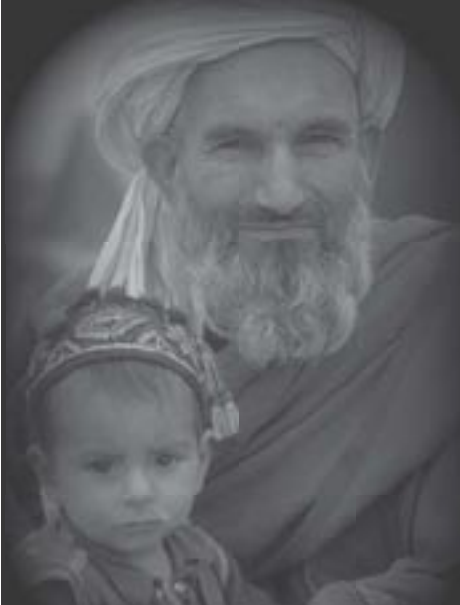

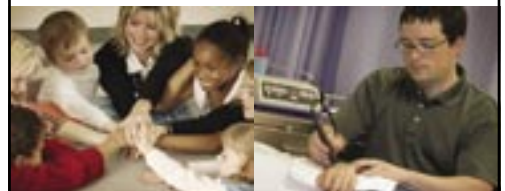

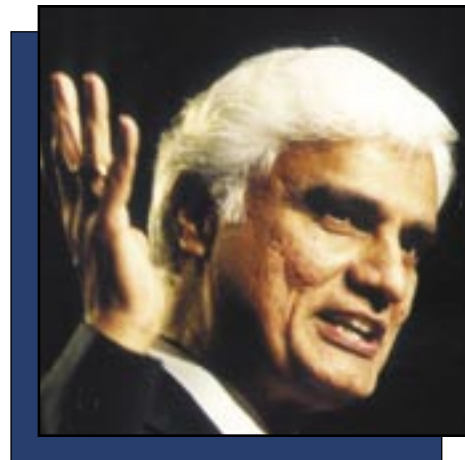
Ravi Zacharias

Ravi Zacharias is president of Ravi Zacharias International Ministries, headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. His weekly radio program, "Let My People Think," is broadcast over 1500 stations worldwide, and his weekday program, "Just Thinking," began airing in November 2004.

For thirty-four years Ravi Zacharias has addressed writers of the peace accord in South Africa, President Fujimori's cabinet; parliament in Peru; military officers at the Lenin Military Academy, and the Centre for Geopolitical Strategy in Moscow. He has also been privileged to bring the main address at the National Day of Prayer in Washington, D.C., an event endorsed by President George W. Bush. Additionally, Dr. Zacharias has spoken twice at the Annual Prayer Breakfast at the United Nations in New York, which marks the beginning of the UN session each year. At the invitation of the President of Nigeria, he addressed the delegates at the First Annual Prayer Breakfast for African Leaders, held in Mozambique.

Dr. Zacharias was born in India in 1946 and immigrated to Canada with his family twenty years later. He received his Masters of Divinity from Trinity International University in Deerfield, Illinois. He has written and published numerous books and is listed as a distinguished lecturer with the Staley Foundation.

Franklin Graham

Franklin Graham, 1996

William Franklin Graham III, born July 14, 1952, is the fourth of five children of evangelist Billy Graham and his wife, Ruth Bell Graham. Franklin and his wife, Jane, live in North Carolina and have four children, and four grandchildren.

At age 22, after a period of rebellion and traveling the world, Franklin committed his life to Jesus Christ while alone in a hotel room in Jerusalem. Soon after, Dr. Bob Pierce, founder of Samaritan's Purse, invited Franklin to join him on a six-week mission to Asia. It was during that time that Franklin felt a calling to work with hurting people in areas of the world affected by war, famine, disease, poverty, and natural disaster.

Franklin was elected to the Board of Samaritan's Purse in 1978, and one year later, following the death of Dr. Pierce, he was elected president of the organization. Today, he serves as president and CEO of the international Christian relief organization headquartered in Boone, N.C. Samaritan's Purse provides relief and assistance in more than 100 countries worldwide.

Franklin conducted his first evangelistic event in 1989 and committed to spend 10 percent of his time preaching. Now he conducts festivals around the world as an evangelist for the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association (BGEA). Since 1989, he has preached to more than 4 million people in cities around the world.

Franklin has authored several books, including *The Name, All for Jesus* (co-authored with Ross Rhoads), *Living Beyond the Limits: A Life in Sync with God*, and his autobiography, *Rebel With a Cause: Finally Comfortable Being Graham*.

Thirty years ago, Dr. Samuel Kamaleson, along with his wife Adala, moved from his Methodist pastorate in India to work with World Vision in the United States. Until his retirement in 1996, he spent most of his time serving as vice president at large. One of his responsibilities (which extended beyond his retirement) has been to organize and speak at pastors' conferences all around the globe. During the Fall of 2004, he was a visiting professor at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky. He holds several degrees, has been a world evangelistic speaker, and is recognized for his enthusiasm for world missions.

Musyoki Muindi is Director of Development and Administration of the Church Mission Society – USA office in New Haven, Connecticut. He joined the Church Mission Society (CMS) after completing a degree in Economics and Political Science at the University of Nairobi. He has worked with CMS for over twelve years. He was also the finance manager for the Episcopal Church of Sudan's office in Kampala from 2002-05, where he helped establish accountability systems and training Sudanese church leaders in Uganda and Sudan in stewardship and management practice. One of his passions is to see the church growing in mission in a way that is strongly evangelistic as well as practical and relevant.

Kenny Blacksmith, First Nations Chief, was born in the Cree community of Mistissini Lake, Quebec and married his wife, Louise in 1975. Three years later, they gave their hearts and lives to Yeshuah-Jesus Christ, and continued to live a simple life of hunting, trapping and fishing - in the traditional way of life of the Cree Nation, grounding them forever in the ways of their people. In 1995, Kenny and Louise moved with their children to Ottawa, Ontario. Four years later, they held the inaugural Gathering Nations Worship in Ottawa where they witnessed the restoration of First Nations people in their identity and integrity. They have since travelled all over the world and to many First Nations communities endeavouring to reach the nations with the beat of the Father's heart. Kenny is one of the authors of the First Peoples Covenant recently developed and signed by Canadian Aboriginal leaders. He is on the Leadership of Watchmen for the Nations.

She has learned a lot about giving and receiving in living with these amazing desert-dwellers. Annoor Hospital now serves 150,000 Bedouins and another 20,000 living in Mafrqa.



Cathie Ostapchuk along with Hilary Price, co-Chaired Just Give Me Jesus, a life-changing 2-day revival event held in September with Anne Graham Lotz of AnGeL Ministries. Previous to that 2-year journey, Cathie has been involved in the worship and women's ministries at her church in Oakville. She has planned large-scale outreach productions at the Living Arts Centre involving choir, orchestra, dance, media and drama.



Hilary Price, born in North Lancashire, England, spent a few years as a small child in Uganda. She is the author of a book entitled, "The Life That Changed My Day" and contributes to "Just Between Us", a US publication for women in ministry. Hilary co-chaired the Just Give Me Jesus conference in Toronto. Hilary continues to share her love for Christ, teaching the Word of God to over 300 women at The Peoples Church through a Thursday evening Bible Study called "The Haven".

As I looked out of the bus window and down at the two children, one pair of eyes spoke to mine and I responded with a grateful smile. Thank you for accepting me so quickly, little one. Thinking that she would now run off and join her friends, I looked away and wondered how the rest of our day would unfold. We had just finished a scenic two-hour long drive to reach this country village and were now watching the monkeys in the trees as we waited for the children to return from school.

Looking out the window again, I was surprised to see the same intent face looking up at me. When I stepped off the bus, she left her spot so she could welcome me to her home. I tried to express my gratitude but my broken Spanish made me feel self-conscious. Frustrated, I silently reprimanded myself for not having brushed up on my Spanish earlier. I frantically tried to make grammatically correct sentences in my head so that the poor child could have some chance of understanding me, but fortunately I was saved further embarrassment when she quietly brought out a small booklet on the gospel. Taking my hand, she led me to a bench, sat me down, handed me the booklet and gestured for me to start reading. Of course. She probably could not read and was eager to have the story read to her. Alright. Not a problem. I knew I could read Spanish better than I spoke it (or so I thought) and thus

began with great enthusiasm. She listened patiently but lovingly pointed out ALL my mistakes, repeated words that I could only hope to pronounce and praised me with "Muy bien" several times along the way. The teacher suddenly became the student and I caught myself inadvertently reading slower and deferring to her whenever I was stumped. We never had the chance to finish our story but the lesson God taught me through this little girl continues to resonate.

I was so concerned about sounding good and pronouncing every word correctly that I completely forgot about the message, the true heart of the story. To my chagrin, I had to eventually admit that this same neglect crossed over to my walk with God. Oh, let me count the ways... Yet, how great is it that we have One who lovingly instructs, corrects and sets our feet back on solid ground when we fall.

Refugee Highway

A journey you will never forget!

MissionFest attendees can experience what it's like to be a refugee

Saturday March 3rd, 11:30am-4:00pm Exhibit Hall Booth J19

You have just been told that rebel members of the evil regime who are ruling your homeland are coming to attack you. You have only minutes to escape! You have no valid passport, and the borders of your country are closed, and closely guarded. How can you escape? Should you risk going by foot through dangerous terrain full of rebels and landmines? Or hide in the back of a transport vehicle and pray that you won't be found, or suffocate to death? Or should you pay a smuggler who "guarantees" to bring you to a "safe country"?

The cost? All your life savings. The risk? Great. The alternative? Imprisonment, torture or death.

What option will YOU choose?

During MissionFest 2007, you will have the opportunity to do something that you may have never done before...you will get a chance to take a journey on the Refugee Highway, and experience some of what it feels like to be a refugee on the move, searching for safety in a hostile world.

As you begin the "simulation" journey, you will be given a profile of a refugee whose identity you will assume. Then you will begin a dangerous trip on the Refugee Highway.

You will truly be travelling (around parts of the Congress Center) and the journey may involve arrest by secret police, attacks by rebels, imprisonment, detention, injury by landmines, and/or years of fear in a refugee camp. Even if you manage to make it to a "safe" country such as Canada, you may be surprised at the kind of reception you receive (or don't receive.)

Your journey will include live situations, taking place in the form of realistic simulations, and it will take about an hour and a quarter to complete.

This year's Refugee Highway Simulation is coordinated by Anne Woolger-Bell, founder and Executive Director of Matthew House, a shelter for newly arriving refugee claimants in Toronto. A team of volunteers from Matthew House, including refugees themselves, will play roles such as rebels, secret police, and visa officers. Some refugee volunteers will share their personal stories of their experiences at various points along the Refugee Highway.

There will be a debriefing session at the end of your

journey. In past years, many participants said the simulation was a one hour journey that changed their perspective on refugees and world refugee issues. Some began to volunteer with refugees locally and overseas!

And you will learn how YOU can make a difference in the lives of refugees!

The simulation will take place from 11:30am until 5pm on Saturday with departures every 15 minutes (last departure at 4pm). You can register in advance on Thursday and Friday evenings and Saturday during the day at the "Refugee Camp" at Booth J19 in the Exhibit Hall B.

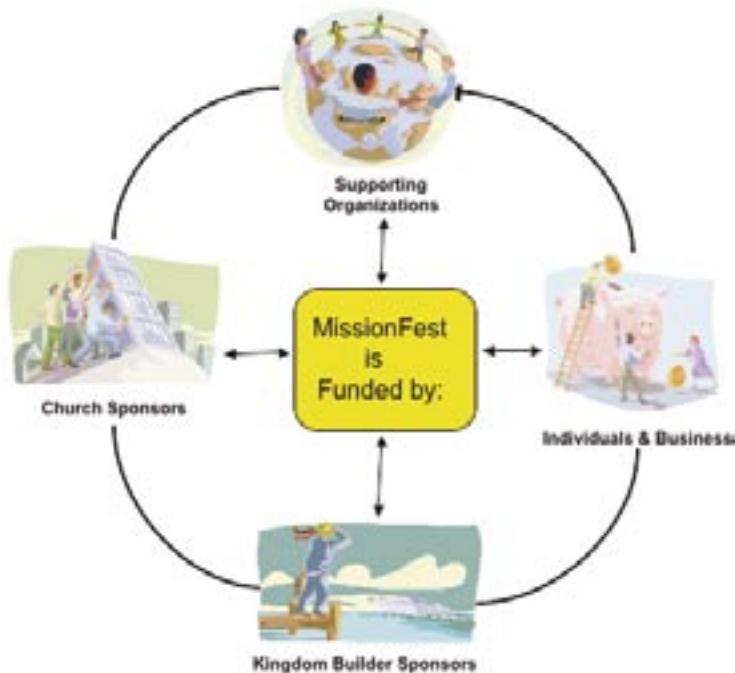
