Every day, more and more of our United States Armed Forces soldiers are returning from overseas. Some of these service men and women have been severely wounded in combat, and require an extended stay in a Veteran's hospital. This leaves their families in a harsh predicament, in some cases having to pay for lodging just to be with their loved ones. For years the Fisher House Foundation has supported these military families by providing housing in the vicinity of Veteran's hospitals throughout the country.

The Alpha Lambda Chapter of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity, an undergraduate business and social fraternity at the University of Vermont, has supported the Fisher House Foundation for four years now, raising over \$7,500 for the cause. We have done so through an event called "Sleep Out for the Soldiers", during which the brothers brave the elements and camp out overnight to collect donations at our chapter house on Main St. in Burlington. This year's event will be held February 24–25, 2012, and will include music, food, a raffle, and more.


