The Zeta Lambda recolonization committee, along with the Sigma Nu Fraternity Headquarters, are excited to announce that recolonization of Zeta Lambda chapter beginning in Spring 2017. Recruitment of our next class of Knights of the Legion of Honor will formally begin in January, just four short months from now. The Headquarters expansion staff, ultimately led by Alex Taylor, Director of Expansion & Recruitment, will lead the initial recruitment effort and subsequent colony training.

The Zeta Lambda recolonization team worked diligently with The University of Tulsa to secure an eventual housing solution. Although Sigma Nu will not occupy the house until sufficient membership, we will take up residence in the 7th Street House also known as the Honors House.

The University has agreed to provide exclusive leasing privilege to our chapter members, and eventually, members will be on a standard university housing agreement very similar to the system adopted by sororities at TU. Based on past successes, the Headquarters staff highly recommends this housing model for a chapter at a university the size of TU.

Now, we need your help! There are three primary ways by which you can be involved and contribute. First, is volunteer to serve on the Alumni Advisory Board (AAB). The AAB is the group of alumni which will work with individual officers to provide support throughout colonization and in our pursuit of becoming a Rock Chapter. Second is being involved in the Alumni Chapter by planning and leading events to continue to reconnect Zeta Lambda alumni. Third is work with the Zeta Lambda Housing Corporation to build the framework for the housing processes. Additionally, we will be working to determine an appropriate number of funds to be raised for cosmetic modifications and upkeep of the property.

After nearly 12 years of dormancy, Zeta Lambda is back! We need each person's assistance and involvement if we are to continue to carry the legacy of Sigma Nu in Oklahoma. Sigma Nu has a deep and rich history in the state of Oklahoma and we are continuing to build our legacy at TU. This year's homecoming reunion will be very special given the recent developments. Further, we look forward to your continued support of the Zeta Lambda chapter of Sigma Nu.
