New Colony Program Installed: The Colonist Rank

On the evening of August 23, 2019, qualifying Candidates of the Zeta Lambda Colony at the University of Tulsa participated in the inaugural Colonist Ceremony at Sharp Chapel on campus. The ceremony was the first of its kind in Sigma Nu history, and is part of the new Colonist Program for Sigma Nu Colonies.

A new colony-level ritual ceremony, crafted by a committee of alumni from various chapters and overseen by Director of Expansion **Evan Winebarger** (Θ K, Georgia Southern), was demonstrated for the first time. Performing the ceremony were Sigma Nu alumni from Zeta Lambda Chapter. In attendance were alumni from Rho (Missouri), Epsilon Epsilon (Oklahoma State), Delta Epsilon (Oklahoma), Zeta Lambda (Tulsa), Delta Omicron (Idaho), Eta Phi (Cal. Sate Los Angeles) and Theta Sigma (Missouri State) chapters, as well as past Regent **Joe Francis** (EE, Oklahoma State).

Those Candidates who participated in the ceremony were promoted to the new colony-level rank of *Colonist*. This rank is designed to mimic the structure of a chartered chapter by elevating worthy Candidates to a higher rank that would otherwise be commensurate with initiation. In

addition, the Colonist Program provides the necessary structure to facilitate mentoring of all members; Colonists are mentored by alumni while the Colonists themselves are charged with mentoring younger members.

This tradition has continued since its installation at Zeta Lambda Colony. Five ceremonies have been conducted where 17 young men have been raised to the rank of Colonist.

Zeta Lambda Colony/Petition Update

The course of events over the last year have been heavily affected by the pandemic caused by COVID-19. Therefore, many functions and events, including chapter and many classes have either been cancelled or moved virtually. Despite the setbacks caused by the pandemic, the colony and its members have continued to develop and continue to work toward earning reactivation of Zeta Lambda's charter.

This semester, the Colony served the Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma packing food kits for families in need. Working in two-three-hour shifts, the Colony packed thousands of meal boxes and collectively achieved our goal of averaging at least six community service hours per member. Six hours of service per member puts our chapter in the "excellent" criteria for the community service portion of our chartering petition. The philanthropic dinner was not held this year because of COVID-19 protocol.

Recruitment has significantly improved over the last year. Seven new members accepted bids in the fall semester. The new members are Eric Schnelker (who serves as Recruitment Chairman), Joel Roth, Chrystian Marshall, Conner Tucker, Elias Martin, Parker Williams, and Trevor Evans.

The COVID-19 pandemic precluded holding a Colonist/Candidate ceremony in the fall 2020 semester. In March 2021, at Sharp Chapel, Zeta Lambda inducted six new



Candidates and promoted three existing Candidates to the rank of Colonist. The new Candidates are Chrystian Marshall, Elias Martin, Eric Schnelker, Joel Roth, Parker Williams, and Trevor Evans. Candidates promoted to Colonist rank are Ryan McGregor, Aidan Holzman, and Maxwell Zines. Colonists Jay Redfearn and William Martin performed as ushers during the ceremony. House Improvements



In 2018, a major update of the chapter house interior, funded by cash and in-kind gifts made by alumni, was completed. In that update, existing carpet in the living room and entry hall was replaced with new, durable vinyl flooring. In addition, the common spaces in the front of the house were painted, and a rock wall was installed around the fireplace to replace an aging and dated mantle. Further improvements include restoration of many composites which have not hung on the chapter house walls in almost two

decades. This major improvement set the tone for the growth of Sigma Nu at TU by making a huge step forward in solidifying our place on the row.

In the spring 2021 semester, led by House Manager Maxwell Zines, the colony decided to perform some house improvements for the upcoming fall recruitment and to accommodate their increasing campus presence. The renovations are being done in collaboration with the TU Housing Office. Some renovations that have been performed are touching up some worn painted surfaces and moving and replacing furniture in the house. Renovations planned over the summer include more painting, replacement of wood paneling around windows, renovation of the billiard room, and construction of an oak table with branded Sigma Nu letters. These renovations are sure to help prepare the colony for fall 2021 recruitment, and make the house a better place for brothers to live, hang out, and perform events and chapter meetings.

Alumnus Spotlight James E. "Jim" Hickerson (Z∧ 172)



Jim Hickerson was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma on May 5, 1944. Between 1944 and 1963 he lived in Midtown Tulsa at which time he entered The University of Tulsa and proudly changed his address to 564 South Gary Place upon joining Sigma Nu Fraternity. Jim's uncle, **Robert W. Bowker** (EE 511, Oklahoma State), pinned Jim at his initiation ceremony in 1963.

Following his time at TU, Jim entered the United States Army where he completed Basic Combat Training (Boot Camp), at Fort Polk, Louisiana, in 1967. During his Army service, Jim was a member of Army bands at Fort Sill, OK (97th); Seoul, Korea (8th Army); Fort Polk, LA (60th); Worms, Germany (76th); Colorado Springs (NORAD); Fort Meade, MD (1st Army); and Atlanta, GA (Forces Command).

Jim continued to study throughout his military career and during his time at Fort Meade he obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology from State University of New York (SUNY), augmenting his TU transcript to 265 undergraduate hours. After 20 years' service in the United States Army, Jim was honorably discharged in 1987; at which time he entered Control Data Institute, graduating with honors with a programmer's certificate before finally settling in at Delta Airlines as a Programming Engineer for the next 18 years.

Jim's life is not without hard work - during summers he helped his family's business, Hickerson Plumbing and Heating, from age 13 until going to college. While in college at TU he worked at Newspaper Printing Corporation, earning enough to augment his scholarship and pay for his own college education.



Throughout his life, Jim has received many civilian and military awards. At Will Rogers High School in Tulsa, he was Concertmaster, Round-Up Conductor, Spring Concert Soloist, band officer, and even received the John Philip Sousa Band Award in 1962 (see photo). He was able to earn a 2/3 tuition scholarship to study music at The University of Tulsa.

Hickerson is a decorated Army veteran who has received the Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Services Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal (×2), Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal (×6), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (×2) and the NCO Professional Development Ribbon. Additional military accolades include Excellence in Competition Badge (.45 caliber pistol), Expert Qualification Badge with Rifle bars (M-14 and M-16 rifles), German Army Military Efficiency Award (bronze) and German Army Marksmanship Awards in bronze and silver.



Jim is a Ruby Life Master tournament Bridge player, and loves to follow college football especially TU, OU and OSU. He is an avid gardener and enjoys reading, cooking and taking care of his backyard pool in his spare time. He boasts of an amazing collection of DVDs and even vintage VHS and Betamax tapes (yes, he still has the players).

Since retirement from Delta Airlines in 2006, Jim lived, as he put it, "a comfortable and tame life in Northwest Georgia" but on February 7, 2017, he sent a text message to his former sweetheart, Frances, asking if she will be attending their Nathan Hale/Will Rogers High School 55th reunion in Tulsa. He never expected her to say, "Yes I will go but only if you will be my date!" How could he possibly say no to that?

Jim and Fran did go on that date, and he has since moved back, by himself, to Tulsa. Jim says he was simply existing in Georgia, but now feels alive again now that he is back in Oklahoma.

Jim and Fran currently live just outside Tulsa, Oklahoma, between Sand Springs and Sapulpa.


John Forte (ZA 545), has been named president and chief executive officer of the Virginia Tech Applied Research Corporation (VT-ARC).
