### KEY TERMS OF THE MONTH



### WHAT IS REDLINING?

Redlining is the discriminatory practice of denying a creditworthy applicant a loan for housing in a certain neighborhood even though the applicant may otherwise be eligible for the loan.

The term refers to the presumed practice of mortgage lenders drawing red lines around portions of a map to indicate areas or neighborhoods in which they do not want to make loans.

### WHAT IS STRUCTURAL RACISM?

Structural racism is a system in which public policies, institutional practices, cultural representations, and other norms work in various, often reinforcing ways to perpetuate racial group inequity.



# WHAT DEFINES A PROTECTIVE HAIRSTYLE?

A protective style is any style that keeps the ends of the hair tucked away and minimizes damage. This styling gives the ends of hair a break from weather conditions to prevent damage. Examples might include braids, twists, faux locs, cornrows and wigs.

Hair is less prone to knotting and snagging on clothing or accessories. The roots and hairline benefit from protective styling as one changes where the places of tension are on our scalp.

#### **New Illinois Law Bans Hair Discrimination in Schools**

Ida Nelson, a Black Chicago mother, successfully fought to protect Black children from hair discrimination after her son was told his braids were a violation of his school's dress code. # Los Angeles Unified School District Invests \$36.5 Million Toward Black Student Achievement Plan


For the first time, the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) has cut the police budget and strategically allocated the funds toward Black students. By decreasing a police presence on campuses, recent data has shown suspension rates have decreased while proficiency levels are up in English and math. 
