On Thursday, January 9, 2014, Alpha Gamma Rho lost one of its most promising young alums – Zachary Daniel Cowart. Zach passed away in Athens suddenly that day from a brain aneurysm. He was 23 years old and a first year student at the University of Georgia's College of Veterinary Medicine. Despite how tragically and swiftly Zach was taken from us, we know his Soul now rests with The Lord in Heaven. He should not and will not be forgotten.

For those who didn't know Zach, he was the heart of the Undergraduate Chapter. He was a leader, a scholar, and someone who knew how to have a good time. He came from an outstanding family in Douglasville. He had a strong passion for agriculture. We knew after taking him to play softball during one of his first recruiting visits to 785 South Milledge that he would be special. When the Alpha Eta Chapter initiated Zach in Fall 2009, we had no idea of the impact he would have on the Fraternity.

Zach Cowart graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture in May 2013. He graduated as one of the most accomplished and honored Brothers we've had in our 87year history. Zach was a member of UGA Cattlemen's Association, Block & Bridle, Order of Omega, Blue Key Honor Society, AGHON, and Gridiron. Zach served as Vice-Noble Ruler of Planning for the Fraternity - a position where he was integral in the installation of the ABAC AGR Chapter and represented Alpha Eta at the 2012 National AGR Convention. Most of all, Zach was loved by his Fraternity Brothers. He loved Alpha Gamma Rho.

Zach would want us to make something positive of his passing. At his family's wishes, the Zachary Cowart Memorial Scholarship Fund has been created by Alumni of Alpha Eta. This scholarship will honor one Undergraduate Brother annually that "works hard and plays hard", just like Zach did. Through the GiveForward online campaign and initial pledges from family members, we have raised over \$10,000. Now it's time for AGR Alumni and Undergraduates to come together to raise the goal of \$30,000 over the next three years to ensure Zach's legacy is carried into the future through his scholarship. To say that we have a lot going on the last two semesters with the Alpha Eta Chapter would be an understatement. We were able to focus on many things to better our Fraternity and make

This past school year was about Brotherhood. We reached an all-time high for numbers of undergraduate Brothers with new-member classes of 20 and 9 in the fall and spring, respectively. denly between the Fall and Spring Semesters. Zach played a huge role in shepherding many men currently in the Fraternity into the men they are today. We were happy to lead the charge to raise money for a scholarship in his honor but are far from done. This past year was about getting involved For the first time in our 87year history, Alpha Gamma Rho had a Brother elected to lead the Fraternity System at UGA. Tillman Daughtrey was elected Interfraternity Council President last November, and he has done an excellent job representing Alpha Eta. We've had Brothers selected as college ambassadors, tapped for prestigious honorary societies, and serving in the highest roles in some of the largest philanthropies on campus. More than anything else, we are pushing to get our younger Brothers more engaged in activities as soon as they join the Fraternity. AGR's own philanthropies, Spring BBQ and Night in the Cold Canned Food Drive, have truly benefitted from our increased presence as they both had record success this year. We are definitely looking to build on this success over the next year.

Lastly, this past year was about improvement. VNR – Scholarship John McLocklin has been hard at work finding more opportunities for tutors, study hours, and resources to push our Brothers toward academic excellence. Our GPA was 3.05 and 3.04 for the fall and spring semester, respectively. It is our goal to raise that to 3.10. We revitalized our meal plan under the leadership of past Noble Ruler Chase Cowart. Our food service has improved dramatically and the results are more of us eating together, better meals, and increased Brotherhood.

When you join Alpha Eta, you learn that the biggest room in the house is room for improvement. We look forward to improving operations and efficiency within our chapter in the coming year.

BENNETT SELECTED TO AG HALL OF FAME



Herbert Bennett

Herbert W. Bennett "188" was recently announced as a 2014 Georgia Agriculture Hall of Fame Inductee. He was a long-time Poultry Specialist with the Georgia Agricultural Extension Service. He was a pioneer during a time of rapid expansion for the poultry industry in Georgia, and came to be known as the "father of the commercial egg industry". One key impact that he had on agriculture was the production of a film titled "Feathering the Nest" – which served as a cutting-edge best management practice guide for those involved in the egg industry. The film was translated into several languages and distributed widely through South and Central America. On top of his many publications regarding poultry husbandry, he was also involved in agricultural policy on the federal level. Bennett received a citation from then U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman for his work on the Agricultural Act of 1970.

He was also very active within industry associations and civic groups until he passed away in 1986. Congratulations to the Bennett family, and we are thankful his legacy will be remembered in the Georgia Ag Hall of Fame. Brother Bennett was a 1947 honorary initiate into the Alpha Eta Chapter.

John Allen Bailey "744" has been inducted into the Georgia Agricultural Education Hall of Fame. Bailey served as an agriculture teacher at Emanuel County Institute for 20 years before becoming a Central Region Area Teacher. His tenure as Central Region Area Teacher lasted from 2001 until this past year, when he took over as Executive Secretary for the Georgia Young Farmers Association. He has been an integral part of many Career Development Events within the Georgia FFA Association, including State Forestry Superintendent, State Agricultural Sales Superintendent, Junior Natural Resources Superintendent, and Assistant National Forestry Superintendent. Bailey has been a member, Director, and Executive Secretary for the Georgia Vocational Agricultural Teachers Association (GVATA). During his tenure, he has been recognized as the Georgia Soil and Water Conservation Man of the Year, GVATA Outstanding State Staff Member, and as a member of Georgia Agri-Leaders Forum.

The CAES Alumni Association Award of Excellence recognizes College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences alumni who have achieved excellence in their chosen field and/or in their community.



Larry Cunningham

R. Larry Cunningham III "698" is the President of R.L. Cunningham & Sons, Inc. (Quitman). Cunningham & Sons is a full service peanut buying point complete with 8,000 tons of onsite storage. Cunningham's is a certified peanut seed sheller that processes seed grown under their supervision and is packaged under the Cunningham label as well as custom shelling, treating, and packaging. The company was founded 1942 but has grown substantially over the past thirty years with hard work and exceptional leadership. During this time peanut buying point tonnage has increased from 2,500 in 1980 to 17,000 in 2012. His company has been recognized as member of the Bulldog 100, which honors the fastest growing businesses owned by UGA Alumni, for the past three years. Cunningham serves on the Board of Directors for the National Peanut Buying Point Association, the Georgia Crop Improvement Association, and the Georgia

Federal-State Inspection Service.. Cunningham is a 1976 initiate of the Alpha Eta Chapter.



Dr. Scott NeSmith

Dr. D. Scott NeSmith "813" is a professor of Horticulture at the University of Georgia, and has been acting director of UGA's Blueberry Breeding Program since 1997. Dr. NeSmith is a global leader in blueberry breeding, and holds over 10 plant patents on different cultivars. He is a winner of the prestigious D.W. Brooks Faculty Award for Excellence in Research for UGA as well as the UGA Research Foundation Inventor's Award - a significant honor given to one university faculty member a year based on innovation and impact outside the university setting. He is a past President of the Southern Region American Society for Horticultural Sciences, and is active in many professional societies and associations. NeSmith's current research includes cultivar development, cultural management, whole-plant physiology, and growth regulator usage for blueberries. He was initiated by the Alpha Eta Chapter in 1982

and currently lives with his wife in Molena, Georgia.

Jim Faircloth "1231" is currently employed as a district manager with Syngenta where he manages a team accountable for crop protection products, seed care products, and triticale in the area of Southern California, Arizona and Hawaii. He has climbed quickly during his five years with Syngenta working as a sales representative in Nebraska, a retail business representative in Georgia, and now as a district manager. He was awarded the 2013 J.W. Fanning Distinguished Young Professional Award by the Ag Economics Association of Georgia. The Alpha Eta Chapter initiated Faircloth in 2003.

Jed Evans "1255" is the Young Farmer Coordinator for Georgia Farm Bureau (GFB). During his time as the Young Farmer Coordinator, Evans has dramatically increased participation and developed training for

young producers on a number of issues. Outside of GFB, Evans is the owner/operator of Daisy Adams Farm – a strawberry and blueberry farm that he is transitioning into an agritourism destination complete with corn maze and hay rides. Dr. W. Scott Monfort "1091" has recently taken on the position of UGA Extension Peanut Specialist – just in time for harvest. Dr. Monfort was the former South Carolina peanut specialist at Clemson University's Edisto Agricultural Research and Extension Center (Blackville, S.C.). He began his career in southwest Georgia at Goldkist cooperative before taking a job as an Extension Agent in Worth County. His work in extension led to a Master's in plant pathology at UGA, then to the University of Arkansas where he received his Doctorate while working as a state plant pathologist. Monfort replaces Dr. John Beasley, who retired from UGA and became chair of the Crop, Soils, and Environmental Sciences Dept. at Auburn University. Georgia is the country's largest grower of peanuts, producing roughly half of the U.S's peanuts. The Alpha Eta Chapter initiated Monfort in 1995. Congrats to Brother Mon-

fort on coming home to Georgia to take on this pivotal role.

CHAMMOUN JOINS COTTON COMMISSION




Chris Chammoun

Chammoun received his Bachelor of Science in Agriculture, majoring in Ag. Economics, from UGA in 2008 and received a Master's Degree in Ag. Economics from Texas A & M University in 2012. His thesis was centered on profitability and consumer demand for native and improved varieties of pecans. In his new position at the Cotton Commission, he will develop communication, outreach, and public relations programs for both cotton growers and the general public.
